The Historic Preservation Office is the official state repository for information on historic properties within the State of New Jersey. Three types of materials may be useful for research concerning World War One in New Jersey.

- 1) National Register files. These files are arranged by county and by municipality within the county. Lists of Register eligible or listed properties by county are available on the office website ([http://www.state.nj.us/dep/hpo/1identify/nrsr\\_lists.htm](http://www.state.nj.us/dep/hpo/1identify/nrsr_lists.htm)). A sample of World War I-related National Register-listed or eligible properties includes:

World War I Memorial (Atlantic City)  
Bethlehem Loading Company (Mays Landing) Archaeological Historic District  
World War I Memorial Bridge (Somers Point-Ocean City) (demolished)  
Rutherford World War I Monument  
Fairview Historic District (Camden)  
Military Park (Newark)

- 2) Local historic surveys ("green binder" surveys). Much, but not all of the state has been surveyed for historic properties. These surveys are filed by County and then by Municipality. Another source that may be useful for those interested in memorials is the New Jersey Save Outdoor Sculpture survey, located near the local surveys.

- 3) Cultural resources reports. Cultural resources reports have generally been compiled to assess the effect(s) of federal or state permitted or funded actions on historic properties. Many World War I-related properties have been the subject of CR reports, and some of these reports contain extensive primary and secondary source historical documentation of properties. A few of the properties included in cultural resource reports are:
